



Tenure-Track Faculty Positions in the Faculty of Medicine University of Ottawa

The **Faculty of Medicine, University of Ottawa**, invites applications for tenure-track faculty positions in the Departments of Biochemistry, Microbiology and Immunology; Cellular and Molecular Medicine; and Epidemiology and Community Medicine. Each department consists of over 100 faculty members with research and teaching focus in multiple Health-related fields.

New faculty members are being sought to strengthen research themes, with particular emphasis on themes related to (1) brain and mind, (2) emerging pathogens, and (3) cardiovascular research. Candidates having expertise in the following areas are being sought:

- Biostatistics and epidemiologic methods, especially with experience relevant to (1) genetic epidemiology/public health genetics (2) communicable diseases or (3) health policy;
- Cardiovascular Biology
- Computational Structural Biology and Dynamic Modeling
- Developmental Neurobiology
- Human Imaging
- Metabolism and Circadian Rhythm
- Microbiology and Infectious Disease
- Molecular Pharmacology
- Systems Biology

Applications for positions at assistant, associate or full professorship will be considered. Applicants must have a PhD and/or MD, or equivalent in a relevant field. The University of Ottawa is a bilingual institution (French and English); candidates will be required to demonstrate a passive knowledge of their second official language to achieve tenure.
